

Classroom Guidance Lesson 2: We Have Goals

OBJECTIVE:

Student will identify one goal he/she has for this school year

OUTLINE:

- Welcome: School counselor will re-introduce self to class and explain that today we'll be reading a story about another one of our friends at Circus School!
- Read: SC reads Calvin Clown's Goal story.
- Review:
 - What is a goal? (something you want to achieve)
 - What was Calvin Clown's goal? (learning to juggle)
 - Did he achieve it right away? (no)
 - How did Calvin Clown feel when juggling was hard? (frustrated)
- What helped Calvin Clown achieve his goal? (starting small with 2 balls and then gradually adding more, working hard, never giving up) How did Calvin Clown feel when he achieved his goal? (proud) How does it feel when you work hard at something? Discuss: "It is important to have goals! When we set goals for ourselves, we have something to work toward and it motivates us to do better. Sometimes it gets hard, but when we don't give up and we keep on trying and working hard, it feels so much better when we achieve it because we know that we can do hard things!" Activity: Students will draw pictures of goals they have for ٠ themselves for the school year. If able, students may write the goal on the line or SC may circulate as students draw and write goals on lines for students as they identify. Share: Students share the goals they identified. Wrap-up: Thank students for sharing their goals today. "I am so ٠ proud of the goals you have! I know that with hard work and a never-give-up attitude, you can achieve them! I can't wait to


